Easter Hymn:

Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia! Let creation join to say: Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens; thou earth, reply: Alleluia!

Prayer: God of resurrection, with the sun rising we have awoken to the promise of new life With the dawn has come a new creation Hear our glad voices and know our joyful hearts For we see this Easter morning that nothing can separate us from your love

Easter is upon us! Resurrection! New life! But this year we cannot gather in church but are invited to celebrate this "joyful" day in our homes, perhaps alone or with those we live with. It will seem strange not to be able to greet each other with "Christ has risen! He has risen indeed!" in church but we can find other ways to say it to friends and family as we can phone or send an email or chat online. The good news of Easter cannot be silenced!

A story: In Greece, Romania, Bulgaria and other Balkan countries, as well as in Russia, it has always been the custom on Easter morning to greet each other with "Christ is risen!" and to reply "He is risen indeed!" In a little village in the Ukraine, the custom continued, even though there was the official suppression of all expression of faith by the communist government. You were not allowed to express your faith publicly. Church services had to be held secretly in a barn, for the church had been confiscated and was used as a storeroom for farm machinery.

The communist official om charge of the village knew fully well that people were breaking the law by attending services in the barn by saying "Christ is risen!" But....he was old and tired, and he didn't want trouble in his village, so he let the people carry on with their life of faith as long as they were not too obvious about it....as long as they did not make it too visible.

But then the old man died and a young government official took over. He was very enthusiastic about the government policies and keen to implement them. So he was determined to put a stop to people going into the barn to worship and to say "Christ is risen!" He said, "If I hear anyone saying it again I will put him or her in prison!"

On Easter day he deliberately walked down the village high street. "Christ is risen!", said an old lady. "Silly woman" the official thought. Still, she must be made an example and so he put the old lady in prison.

Further down the road a young man greeted his girlfriend with "Christ is risen!" and she replied "He is risen indeed!" Two more for the prison!

And then a well-known and respected farmer came right up to the official and said "Christ is risen!" After this the prison was full and people were still saying "Christ is risen!" to each other on the street. The young official did not know what to do so he telephoned his

boss, the District Commissar, who said to him, "Don't be such a fool. You can't send the whole village to prison. And what would happen to the farms?"

And so the people were let out of prison and the whole village now went to the service in the barn. *Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!* Every Easter, for nearly 2000 years, Christians have been saying this....Christ is risen and not death but life has the last word. That is the good news of Easter and this good news cannot be silenced!

The Lectionary Gospel Reading is: **John 20: 1-18.** The resurrection of Jesus and Jesus appears to Mary in the garden.
