Message

Theme – watchmen & women

Although I only asked for the first 11 verses to be read I will refer to the rest of the chapter so when you go home I suggest you read the whole chapter

We are living in strange times with COVID 19 and its consequences, and the lock downs and their effects on our lives

So we are living through something we have never experienced before at least people of my generation and younger haven't

Ezekiel was living a strange time

He had been carted off to Babylon when Nebuchadnezzar had invaded Judah, the southern kingdom along with the king and the higher echelons of society.

But if you carry on reading chapter 33 then we will note that the news has come that finally the Babylonians had enough of Judah and its rebellious ways and had sacked it completely. Burning the temple and carrying off most of the rest of the population.

This was the scene that Ezekiel was prophesying earlier on in the book but in our chapter the theme seems to take a different line after the judgements of the previous chapters. Now Ezekiel is being told to tell the people that they have to make choices

The comparisons with today are stark

Later on in the chapter God condemns those who are making a profit out of their situation a bit like today – I have heard stories like people being phoned and the person on the phone saying that they have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for the COVID and then the person on the phone is asking for your bank details because you have to pay to be tested yourself. A scam and there are plenty of others out there.

But there is a flip side of this as well in that others are really trying to help people – and I hope we do not lose that sense of community

But many people are afraid and wondering why and are turning to all sorts of things and many to churches web pages

The Gas Street church in the centre of Birmingham had 2,500 hits last week for their morning service– that is far more than the building can actually hold

And I believe that God is doing a new work amongst the people
As he said in Isaiah 43:19 See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

Is God doing a new thing in this country?

And if so what is to be our response?

Is it to do the things we did before the lockdown?

Or is it to listen to God and respond to his commands?

To do new thing?

The passage talks about our responsibility to be a watchman or woman, to warn others about the results of their sin and that has always been the responsibility of God's people to proclaim the message that although God is a God of love he is also a God of judgement.

And as it says in Romans 6:23 The wages of sin is death

But also, that God loves those who come to him

Many people are seeking God at this time and it is our responsibility to be as Ezekiel says and to warn people about the judgement of God

Many will hear and simply say 'ok so what' But it mustn't stop us

Those who respond will find – as we already know a great deal of peace and certainty in these unsettled times

And they can sing of God's love as we can sing although not in church yet except for choirs
