REFLECTION

I'm sure the image here is familiar to us all. It seems however hard we try, however often we weed there are always signs of probably unwanted growth in our paths. The plants seem to be able to find that smallest



of cracks in the surface and will make their way through and if left unchecked will very quickly take over. The garden next to ours is a daily reminder of this, the elderly owner is now in a home and noone is taking care of things and the whole garden is over run with growth! New growth will always find a way through.

Jeremiah talks of new growth, a new branch. However difficult things were at the time Jeremiah stayed hopeful. Disaster was all around. Everywhere was laid waste, desolate and desperate. But Jeremiah points to a new shoot that will grow – a branch- a sign that God is at work in the middle of the chaos. This righteous branch will be the Messiah, the chosen one. That of course is Christ, God coming alongside us in the person of Jesus.

We are part of the body of Christ, part of that righteous branch. We are God's branch here in this community, growing and blossoming for all around us. Just like the local branch of any local service, just like Sainsbury's we are here to serve the locality, bringing hope into the community, demonstrating goodness and holiness in an ordinary everyday way that is attractive to friends and neighbours.

We hear Paul writing to the new Christians in Thessalonica where he praises them for how faithful they have been during their persecution. He tells them that it gives him great joy to hear their story and he prays that their numbers will increase and he urges them to love one another and everyone they meet. In that way they can be confident of meeting Christ when he comes again. God's branches grow and flourish when they care about one another, look out for each other and celebrate each other's gifts and look outwards to encourage those who are not yet members of the branch.



In the Gospel reading Jesus encourages us to stand up, raise our heads and look for the signs of God's kingdom amidst all the chaos of our world today. As Christians, we are not to faint with fear at the things going on around

us. We are to stand tall as symbols of hope for our community. Like the fig tree we are to be filled with new life to show that good times – God's times- are both now and still to come. If we get bowed down by the struggles and confusions and worries of our world we will not be able to shine with the light of Christ – for others. We are to be alert and watchful for the signs of God at work in our world and then stand and tell everyone about them.

Advent is a time for watching and waiting. Waiting for the birth of Jesus at Christmas, waiting for Jesus to come again — to call the world to himself Watch for the signs of God's kingdom, listen and be open for what God calls you to do as a member of his local branch. How can we show God's love to one another and to everyone in the community. Those who God loves without a beginning or an end. Let us pray that we are ready with love and warmth, care and compassion to be signs of hope and symbols of God's love which will be there come what may. We must not fear what's happening in the world, we must stand tall and God's righteous branches where we are and proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ.
